 - The 2017 Log Cabin Invitational Golf Tournament will be on Monday, 25 September 2017. The golf tournament will be held at Innsbrook and dinner along with a Silent Auction will follow at the Innsbrook Clubhouse.
 - o Planning meetings for the event will begin in May.
 - o Mr. Gene Williams will be joining the Planning Committee.
- 7. Restoration Report Wayne Edwards.
 - Works continues around the cabin.
 - Gravel has been spread
 - Beams are being added to the Tobacco barns
 - LED lighting is being obtained for the front and rear cabin porches
 - The wooded area behind the Pavilion is being cleared and will make a nice picnic area. It was suggested that a table be purchased.
 - Electrical outlet will be placed on the electrical pole.
 - A suggestion was made that the current tobacco garden be replaced with an herb garden. Herb gardens were common in frontier gardens.
 - The issue of a caretaker was again discussed.

 - John Welter reported in Cece's absence. The Society has been advised to do a dig on its own.
 We will be looking into doing so.
 - It was suggested that IHS purchased a book on the topic of pottery shards and their identification. John Welter will do so

- 11. Schnucks Cemetery Project John Welter.
 - A proposal has been written and sent to Keith Thompsen to be presented to the State Historical Preservation Office (SHPO). This has been delayed as Innsbrook Corporation is still in negotiations to begin the new development area.
- 12. Silent Docent John Welter
 - A committee has been formed to address the development of information for signage around the cabin. It is to meet again within the coming three weeks.
 - o John Welter developed a 'strawman' of possible topics to be used for the signage.
 - Informational material was received from Pannier regarding printing and development of signage. While using local resources to build the platforms for signage was discussed, it proved to cost-prohibitive.
