1. Minutes -

Minutes of the 12 March 2024 were seconded and approved.

2. Financial – Teresa Edwards.

a. Financial Reports for the period 12 March 2024 through 13 May 2024 were reviewed, seconded, and approved.

b. The year 2023 was the first year that income exceeded \$50,000. This triggered IRS that IHS must submit a full tax return. Since we are recognized as a 501(c)(3), the portion of the US Internal Revenue Code that allows for federal tax exemption of nonprofit organizations that meet the code's requirements., we must submit six different schedules along with other documentation. Steve Morice is assisting Teresa Edwards with this input.

3. BY-LAWS – Dave Boeckmann.

The organization's By-Laws were amended in two areas. They were reviewed, seconded, and unanimously accepted.

a. ARTICLE VIII- Officers

Section 1. ...At the initial meeting of the Board of Directors, the then-constituted Board shall appoint officers, <u>each of whom shall hold his/her office three (3) years or until a successor each his/her office is selected</u>. This is a change from 2 years.

Section 10. The organization shall indemnify the officers, directors, and volunteers from all damages claimed in any civil lawsuit arising out of the activities of the IHS organization, including the cost of defense. New addition.

4. Discovery Day – Paula Dooley

a. The day was a great success. The weather was beautiful and the crowd large. There was an estimated 250 people attending.

b. The Society gained 5 new members and 3 past members rejoined. At least 80 membership forms were distributed.

c. The demonstrations were a good draw and were well-received. Also, the entertainment provided by the Dave & Bryon Duo added to the festivities.

5. Golf Tournament—Scott Francin

a. The Tournament is looking good.
